For your stay here you will first have some administrative steps to follow before settling in to fully concentrate on your research. This brochure is intended to outline the procedure and to help guide you through, one step at a time.

Where to begin:

There are several, bureaucratic steps ahead of you upon starting your PhD in Heidelberg, whether you are arriving from a different country, a different university or after having completed your MSc in Heidelberg.

Exhaustive information regarding regulations for entering Germany, admission to the Faculty of Biosciences and matriculation (enrolment as a student) etc., is found on the Graduate Academy's website (the relevant links will be listed for each step below). BUT, since you are already accepted as an HBIGS student (into a structured graduate program), some steps may be altered or skipped all together, so please read through the following guidelines carefully to avoid any unnecessary confusion.



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If you are arriving from a different country:

Note: Being an HBIGS student means, that you have already been offered a work contract from a supervisor here in Heidelberg. You will need an acceptance letter which is the written confirmation from the University professor that he or she will supervise your doctoral training and dissertation until their completion. You will require this letter to apply for your Visa to enter Germany.

Your prospective supervisor is responsible for issuing this acceptance letter, which generally contains the following information:

- ✓ the full name and birthdate of the doctoral candidate
- ✓ the working title of the planned dissertation
- ✓ the date on which supervision of the doctoral project will begin, including salary grade prospective contract duration (one year)
- ✓ Name of lab group, supervisor, research
- ✓ an explicit declaration that the supervisor will supervise the doctoral candidate with the chosen dissertation topic throughout the duration of his or her doctoral training

Please do not forget to apply for visas for your family members, should they be accompanying you, far enough ahead of time. The application process is different from that for visiting scholars and can, in certain circumstances, take longer. If members of your family would like to be gainfully employed while in Germany, they will probably need a residence permit that allows the permit holder to be employed.





Once you are in Germany:

Your Registration/admission as a PhD Student at the Faculty of Biosciences (mandatory)

Once you arrive in Heidelberg and have settled your visa, health insurance and accommodation issues, it is time to prepare your PhD Student registration with the Faculty of Biosciences.

For this step, please <u>do not</u> refer to the Graduate Academy's website for information, <u>since</u> registering with the Faculty of Biosciences, with HBIGS as your graduate school, is a little different:

- 1. you already have a supervisor
- 2. you do not need a doctoral agreement
- 3. you do not register with heiDOCS (this will be done automatically by the Faculty <u>after</u> your registration)
- 4. The admission to the Faculty of Biosciences will be undertaken by the HBIGS office.

All the required information and forms are emailed to you by the HBIGS office upon beginning your PhD, but just in case, you can also find them on the website of the Faculty of Biosciences:

And yes, to answer the FAQs at this point:

1. You will need the <u>original documents</u> of your Bachelor and Master's degree/ transcript (no PDF's of electronic copies allowed)

OR

if applicable: *certified translations* of both certificates and transcripts into either *German or English*

(Copies of the originals will be made here in the office, during the appointment!)

2. All forms must have <u>original signatures</u> (no electronic, or scanned signatures), since they are official and legally binding.

You need to submit the **Epigeum "Research Integrity" E-Learning course Certification**:

(This course will require you to login to the University's Moodle platform, for which you will need your "Uni-ID". You will get this from your institute, once you start your PhD. The course is online, done at your own pace/time, free of charge. Please also complete the supplements, completing the entire course, for which you will be mailed a certificate)

NOTE: if you have any questions regarding the registration, please contact HBIGS. We are your graduate school and are here to guide you through this process.



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Once you have collected all the necessary documents, have completed/signed the forms, and achieved the Epigeum certificate, we ask you to **make an appointment with the HIBGS office:**

This should be done within (max) 6 weeks of commencement.

Enrollment/matriculation (Obtaining your Student Card) (mandatory)

Once you have the letter from the Faculty of Biosciences confirming your admission, you can proceed with the matriculation.

Note: since you are accepted as an HBIGS student, your language proficiency has already been checked and approved, so no need for further action in this regard.

Exception for International PhD students have the possibility to enroll as a short-term PhD student in order to profit instantaneously from the collegiate benefits. You are not bound to enrollment deadlines. You can benefit from this status for a maximum of two semesters, after which you are required to present the original "letter of admittance" (in German: Annahme als Doktorand) from the Faculty of Biosciences.

Finding Accommodation

As more than 30,000 students in Heidelberg are looking for a roof over their head, it might be both very expensive and hard to find an accommodation. Therefore, it might be a good idea to live outside of the Heidelberg city limits. The rent is usually much cheaper and the "Deutschlandticket" enables you to use the public transportation system at a reduced fare.

Please note that after having moved into a new place, you are obliged to register your new residence **within seven days** at the appropriate Bürgeramt (**local public office**).


